NEW RESPECT INITIATIVE LAUNCHED TO SUPPORT YOUNG REFEREES

Liverpool County FA are launching a brand-new yellow armband Respect initiative this week at a variety of venues and events across the Merseyside area. Prior to the start of this evening's game against Altrincham will be the launch of the scheme in Sefton, run in conjunction with the local Craven Minor Junior Football League.



Aimed at supporting young match officials in the area, the new initiative will see yellow armbands introduced for all referees under the age of 18 in youth football to remind everyone that the referee is still subject to the children's safeguarding legislation – and should therefore be protected, encouraged and treated with respect.

David Horlick, Liverpool County FA Referee Development Manager, said: "Over 35% of our referees across the County FA area are under the age of 18. It is vitally important that they are supported and developed to ensure they continue to referee for many years to come, with some of them hopefully progressing to officiate in the higher echelons of the game."

Gordon Johnson, the County FA Designated Safeguarding Officer, stated "The idea of the yellow armbands is to help identify those referees who are under the age of 18 and to ensure they are supported and at the same time ensure that managers, coaches, parents and spectators think twice about making abusive or insulting comments to the young referee. Essentially, the armbands are to remind adults that the match official is still a child, learning to be the best official they can be. Let's remember, they are there because they enjoy being involved in football, it's their game too as well as the players."

David Pugh, Liverpool County FA Chief Executive Officer, added: "We are fully committed to The FA's Respect programme and the 'We Only Do Positive' mantra. We have implemented the FA Respect initiatives at all levels of the game locally and have also introducing our own schemes, like this referee armband initiative for officials under the age of 18. It is important that Respect is embedded across all levels of the game and that an innovative approach is taken to proactively educate the importance of Respect across our game."

Together with the Yellow armbands all under 18 referees are also being supplied with a supporting guidance booklet on 'Promoting Safety and Respect Within the Game', the contents of which offer further advice, support and contacts information details for the young officials as they embark upon or continue along their refereeing journey.



Gordon Johnson added further, "The new initiative has received some great exposure and feedback via social media leading up to our launch. We would like to thank everybody involved for the part they have played, especially Southport Football Club for allowing us to launch locally ahead of this evenings National League North game against Altrincham and also the young referees from the Craven Minor League who are here this evening assisting us in the launch. Moving forwards, we will now be working closely with all of our youth leagues and young referees to ensure that the armbands are visible across the Liverpool County FA area, whilst also ensuring that young officials receive the appropriate level of support and respect."

This season has heralded the news that yet another island team are hoping to enter the Non-League pyramid.

Following in the footsteps of Guernsey, who play at Step 4 and the newly formed Jersey Bulls, who are currently competing in Step 6, a group from the Isle of Man have unveiled plans to create their very own football club, with ambitions to play in the Northwest Counties League in time for the start of next campaign.

This is brilliant news both for the Non-League system and players and fans living on the Isle of Man.

Last year I went to visit Guernsey, where I thoroughly enjoyed watching a match and have subsequently interviewed their manager Tony Vance on a number of occasions.

It was brilliant to see how the island's community had really embraced the team and the atmosphere on matchday was a superb thing to be a part of.

When speaking to Vance it quickly becomes clear just how much pride he has taken in the project and the importance that it has had in developing young players on the island.

Whereas before, making the jump into the professional ranks was extremely hard for young footballers on the island, they now

have the opportunity to showcase their talents in England throughout the year.

One of the big drawbacks of starting an island team is the high costs involved, which include having to pay for the travel of both themselves and their opponents, however both Guernsey and Jersey Bulls have demonstrated how, with the support of their local communities, these steep financial commitments can be managed.

The fact that Jersey Bulls were able to attract almost 1000 fans for their very first fixture at the start of the month shows both how island clubs can develop revenue and help to cultivate a special following across the community.

The Isle of Man bid is being led by National Team manager Paul Jones.

When interviewing him last week I was immediately struck by his immense passion for football on the island and his determination to see the project through

There have been plans in the pipeline to start a team on the Isle of Man for almost 15 years but for one reason or another the project has never come to fruition, until now

I wish Paul and his colleagues the absolute best of luck in creating a club because these island teams have the potential to unite their communities in such a unique way.

His career had begun with Liverpool FC's Academy, before he moved to Bury, where he made his Football League debut in March 2011. At the end of that year he went on loan to Blyth Spartans. After returning to Gigg Lane, another loan followed, at Hinckley United. After he had been released by Bury, he joined Nantwich Town in the summer of 2013. However, he left for Ashton United in March 2015 but, at the start of the following campaign, he was at Ramsbottom United. However, he rejoined Nantwich in 2016. His energetic performances and long-range shooting soon made him a popular figure with supporters of Altrincham. His regular starts were curtailed by injury in February 2019.

SIMON RICHMAN

Midfielder/winger Simon Richman is a product of the Bolton Wanderers' academy and the Port Vale youth system. He broke through into the Valiants' first team in League One in 2007-08 and made 48 League appearances for them in all, mostly in 2008-09 in League Two, when he was voted the club's Young Player of the Season. In summer 2010, he had trials with Southport and Worcester City, before joining City and making eight league appearances in the Blue Square Bet North. Simon became Lee Sinnott's first signing at Altrincham in summer 2011 but his early

Alty career was marred by injuries and illness. Having mostly played in right midfield, Simon completed the campaign in central midfield, a position he also played in during 2012-13. Summer 2013 saw him as an integral part of the Great Britain Universities' team which won the silver medal in the world games in Kazan, Russia.

SEAN WILLIAMS

Sean rejoined Altrincham on 21 May 2018, having first signed for the club, from Colwyn Bay, in May 2014. Prior to that, he had another spell with the Bay, and had also played for FC Halifax Town where he was part of their promotion squad from Conference North. Earlier, he also spent time with Stockport County, Vauxhall Motors, Hyde and Skelmersdale United. After 25(+12) appearances for Altrincham, Sean was surprisingly released by Altrincham at the end of the 2014-15 season and, like his ex-Alty team-mates Kyle Perry and David Parton, he joined Hednesford Town for 2015-16. By the start of 2016-17 season he had moved on to AFC Telford United but, in mid-November 2016, he signed for Warrington Town where he became an important figure in their reaching the promotion play-offs in 2017-18. Sean was impressing in the Alty midfield when his season was interrupted by injury in late

YOUSDAN HINITALE

July 2017, just after he had left Salford City where he had scored ten times and provided eleven assists in 48 appearances is 2016-17 in National League North. The previous season he had netted 18 times in 54 appearances for the Ammies. Jordan's earlier clubs include CMB Sports Club, Walshaw Sports Club, Shevington, Padiham, Ramsbottom United (2012) and New Orleans Jesters (USA). At Ramsbottom, he had scored more than thirty goals in 100 or so appearances befor following the Rams' management duo of Bernard Morley and Anthony Johnson to Salford City in January 2015. A versatile player, at previous clubs he has turned out as a right-winger and right-back as well as striker. By mid-November he had established himself as Alty's leading scorer in all competitions and crowned a fine

He started 2018-19 with seven goals from eight starts before being suspended for a game and then missed further game time

with a persistent eye problem. Nevertheless, he netted nine times in his first ten games of the campaign.

JOHN JOHNSTON

John Johnston was manager Phil Parkinson's first signing in mid-May 2017. A tricky right-winger, with electrifying pace, John finished 2016-17 season at Salford City, a club he had joined in 2016. His career started at Kidsgrove Athletic, before he moved to Leek Town in July 2013. His good performances at Harrison Park led to a move to Crewe Alexandra in January 2014 but they immediately loaned him back to Leek till the end of the 2013-14 season. John's form was rewarded when he was named as the Evo-Stik League First Division South Young Player of the Year for 2013-14. In that same season he actually played against Alty when Leek won at Moss Lane in the FA Trophy.

SCEEN MOT

Born in Warrington, Tom came through the Chester FC youth system (2013-16) where he made 3(+21) first-team appearances under manager Neil Young. Tom then went on loan to 1874 Northwich FC and, in January 2015, he started a month's loan at Marina


In December 2015 he went on a month's loan to Salford City, with a similar loan stay at Hednesford Town following that. In 2016 he briefly joined Hednesford before a summer 2016 move to AFC Telford United. However, he soon moved on to Warrington Town (Sept. 2016) and then Droylsden (Dec. 2016 to Feb. 2017). At that point he joined Nantwich Town and followed manager Phil Parkinson to Altrincham in summer 2017. Tom ended the 2018/19 season at FCUM but reioined Altrincham in late May 2019

Lewis made his debut for Alty in the preseason friendly at Atherton Collieries on 16 July, 2019. He opened his goalscoring accoubt in the following friendly, against Blackpool, before missing the next game to go on trial at Barnet.

He returned to play part of the following match against AFC Fylde, who were his most recent club. His previous clubs were Leeds United, Nottingham Forest, Barrow and Guiseley. Leeds-based, Lewis had trials at Carlisle United in summer 2018.

THE NATIONAL LEAGUE RECENTLY CELEBRATED ITS? 40TH ANNIVERSARY, SINCE THE FIRST FIXTURES TOOK PLACE IN THE THEN-CALLED ALLIANCE PREMIER LEAGUE!

Those of us of a certain age remember our Chairman at the time refusing to join saying " it will never catch on as there is too much travelling" He alienated a lot of Southport fans at the time and our gates plummeted because of it. Forty years on it's still going strong and we are at the second level.

We have played 19 seasons in the top flight with 7 in the North. It took Southport until 1993/94 to make it to the top flight of NL Football and some very dark days in between.

An allocation of 20 Clubs made up the fifth tier, with Altrincham claiming the title in the inaugural season.

The Noel Kelly trophy remained at Moss Lane at the end of the first two campaigns.

Fastest Goal Colin Cowperthwaite scored the

fastest goal in 1979 against Kettering Town after just 3.5 seconds.

Paul Culpin of Nuneaton Borough holds the record for the most goals in a season in the 1984-85 season with 41 goals.

The highest attendance for a regular season game is 11,085 between Bristol Rovers and Alfreton Town at the end of the 2014-15 season.

Barnet and Macclesfield have won the most National League titles.

John Still has won the title with Maidstone United, Dagenham & Redbridge and Luton Town.

Crawley Town with 105 hold the record for the most points in one Conference season in 2010-11.

9-0 is the biggest victory margin recorded 5 times, most recently Tranmere Rovers v Solihull Moors in 2017.



FROM THE ARCHIVES



THE FOOTBALL SEASON OF 1960/GISAWITHE INTRODUCTION OF A BRAND NEW COMPETITION FOR THE CLUBS OF THE FOOTBALL LEAGUE. DISCUSSIONS HAD GONE ON FOR A FEW YEARS BEFORE THE LEAGUE SECRETARY OF THE DAY, ALAN HARDAKER, BROUGHT HIS AND OTHER'S IDEAS TO A SUCCESSFUL CONCLUSION. IT WOULD BE A KNOCKOUT COMPETITION FOR ALL THE 92 LEAGUE CLUBS TO BE PLAYED ON MID WEEK EVENINGS AND COMMENCING IN THE AUTUMN. MATCH ATTENDANCES HAD BEEN IN DECLINE AND NOW THAT MOST CLUBS HAD FLOOD LIGHTS IT WAS DECIDED THAT THE NEW CUP COMPETITION COULD PROCEED. IN IT ALLY IT HAD NO SPONSORSHIP, NOT REALLY THE DONE THING AT THE TIME, BUT LATER IT BECAME ASSOCIATED WITH NAMES SUCH AS CARLING, RUMBELOWS AND THE MILK MARKETING BOARD AND OTHERS, AND NOW OF COURSE IT IS THE CARABOOCUP.

replays if needed and in a number of cases three games were required to find a winner. Before 1966 the Final was decided over two games played on the grounds of the finalists. Wembley Stadium hosted it's first Final on March 4th 1967 when QPR defeated West Brom 3-2.

The draw for Round 1 in 1960 was not regionalised. 46 clubs took part in the First Round and 41 clubs received byes to Round 2. Five clubs declined to take part. Arsenal, Spurs, West Brom, Wolves and Sheffield Wednesday.

We were drawn away at Plymouth Argyle on October 12th 1960. In subsequent years the competition started in September and then August. We probably had the longest journey all the way to South Devon pre Motorways. Manchester United had a similar trip to play at Exeter City. There were two London Derby games including Chelsea's visit to Millwall where they won 7-1.

The Plymouth programme informed readers that there had been many arguments as to the wisdom of forming a new competition but concluded that only time would tell if it would have the same glamour or attraction of the FA Cup.

As for us Plymouth had read good reports of our football and they would not be underestimating us. We lost 2-0 but Argyle were close to the top of Division 2 and ahead of Liverpool in the table.

We played in the League Cup for seventeen seasons without conspicuous success but managed to reach Round 2 six times and host games at Haig Avenue against sides from the top two Divisions. Newcastle United Manchester City and Stoke City were played and the Geordies should have visited us for a second time in 1975 but that tie was switched to the North East prompting a letter of mine opposing the move appearing in the Visiter.

The second round tie against Manchester City was played here exactly 50 years ago. We had qualified by beating Oldham Athletic in Round 1 by 5-1. City were the FA Cup holders and were due to take part in the European Cup Winners Cup over the Winter. Their team was packed with Internationals and well known players of the day. They had a front five consisting of Mike Summerbee, Colin Bell, Francis Lee, Colin Bowyer and Stan Bowles. The match was made all ticket and an attendance of 11215 who paid £2910 were present to see Francis Lee give City an early lead.

Bobby Wraith making his debut in goal in place of the injured John Armstrong having no chance of saving. The score remained in City's favour to half time but the Port had played well and caused the visiting defence several problems. About 20 minutes into the second half City doubled the score when Alan Oakes shot past Wraith from 25 yards and they made absolutely sure with a late third from Colin Bell netted with the ball going in off the underside of the bar. It had not been a one sided game as the Port displayed several good

attacking ideas and both George Andrews and Eric Redrobe went close.

On March 7th 1970 City won the League Cup at Wembley defeating West Brom 2-1 with virtually the same side that had defeated Southport. On their way to the Final they had knocked out both Merseyside Giants, QPR and Manchester United.

On April 29th 1970 they won the European Cup Winners Cup beating the Polish side Gornik in Vienna by 2-1. The attendance that evening was around 11000. I have seen conflicting figures as to it's size. It might well have not been as big as the crowd mustered on our ground back on September 3rd 1969.

Yes, we'll just go out and buy that striker that could win us the league but at what cost to the future of the club concerned, it's rife and needs to stop.

It happens so often it needs to be controlled far better meaning the EFL and other leagues throughout the land surely have to take a more active role in the governance of football.

The Bury fans enjoyed winning their leagues and

the progression over the last few years but rode roughshod over the many companies they owed money to.

Clubs in our league have done it in the past, reformed, which is great, but the money owed to the local businesses in the area is never paid over and they then go out of business because of the debts.

Something has to happen and the painful lesson Bury have learned, and possibly Bolton by the time you read this, needs to be a lesson that never happens again.

On a happier note, what a great Ashes Test we had at Headingly with probably the best day of sporting action on record or at least it was high up there. I don't have Sky so I was following on the radio but every time I switched my radio on to listen a wicket fell so once Broad was out for 0 I thought I better not switch on again fully expecting a defeat. I resorted to following the BBC feed on my phone highly tempted to switch on when it got down to less than 20 to win. I resisted the temptation so the whole of England has me to thank for not switching my radio on and winning the Test.

I am lucky enough to have a ticket for the first day's play at Old Trafford tomorrow. My weather record at Test Matches isn't the best with plenty rained off down the years. It's fingers crossed for tomorrow.
